

Concerns about Your Child and Classroom

Please bear in mind that teachers make decisions taking into consideration both the individual child and what best serves the class as a whole. This may require compromise and flexibility on the part of individual students and families.

If you have a concern about your child's experience in the classroom, it is very important that you first approach the teacher for a meeting. Sometimes several discussions may be necessary to continue making progress on problem areas. If a parent feels that this route has not addressed their concerns, the matter should be brought to the Instructional Leader.

Concerns about School Policy

Problems with school policies and procedures should be brought to the school office, either in person or in writing. You may also make an appointment with the Head of School if you feel that would be helpful.

If these steps fail to resolve the issue of concern, then parents may bring an item to the Board of Directors for final resolution. The Head of School or the Board President can be contacted for information on Board procedure.
